**Subject: Legal Declaration – An Invitation to Action for Global Sustainable Peace**

**With greetings and respect,**

For more than seven decades, the United States of America and its Western allies have conducted extensive military and political interventions across various regions of the world under the pretext of protecting national interests. In many cases, these actions have led to nothing but the destruction of infrastructure, the displacement of peoples, and regional instability. One of the most prominent examples of this approach is the issue of Palestine—a land whose indigenous people have been deprived for decades of their natural right to live freely, safely, and independently.

In 1948, a portion of Palestinian territory was handed over to the State of Israel—a regime which, from its inception, with the political, military, and financial support of Western powers, expanded far beyond the designated borders. It displaced hundreds of thousands of Palestinians and effectively blocked the realization of any just solution for peace. Over time, the land remaining for Palestinians was reduced to less than 13%, which itself has been subject to ongoing blockades and repeated attacks.

The events of October 7 must be understood in the context of decades of oppression, occupation, discrimination, and injustice. The actions taken by Palestinian groups were a desperate response to unbearable pressure and the vanishing hope for a fair and just peace. Today, nearly two years later, the Gaza region lies in ruins, and millions of innocent people live under inhumane conditions. Yet, Western governments continue their unilateral support for Israel and even threaten or sanction those nations that merely offer political and legal support to the Palestinian people.

Mr. Trump, as long as the concept of peace is defined solely within the framework of unilateral political and economic interests, the realization of sustainable peace will remain impossible. True peace can only be achieved when it is built upon justice, human dignity, human rights, and universal values—a peace that holds meaning not only for Palestinians but for all nations.

At this critical moment, a fundamental question arises: Are you—and other Western leaders—willing to abandon coercive and unilateral policies and take steps toward a path that leads to a comprehensive, just, and humane peace? A peace not forged to protect the interests of the powerful, but to honor humanity and divine values?
